The first film about the Roma slavery, written from a Roma perspective, based on real events from 1855. Part of a feature film project.

In the household of a wealthy Romanian noblewoman in 1855, Maria, a Roma-Gypsy slave, fights to obtain freedom for her son Dinca. During slavery time, up until 1856, the Romanian equivalent of the word "forgiveness" was used when referring to freeing someone from slavery (the Roma slave was "forgiven" from slavery).

By whom is history being told?

The first theatre play on the topic of Roma slavery, written after extensive research.

"The Great Shame" ("Marea Rusine") is the first theater play to address the unknown subject of the 500 years of Roma slavery in Romania and its profound impact on Roma identity. The actors performed historical documents.

The play explores how this history continues to influence the interactions between Roma and non-Roma today and creates an essential platform for discussing historical and contemporary racial discrimination faced by the Roma community in Romania.

"The Great Shame" holds a unique distinction as the first play featuring Roma women to be embraced by a Romanian state theatre (Excelsior, 2018). The project was first developed as a theatre play, then developed into a video-art.

Published in <u>The Palgrave HandBook of Theatre and Race</u> and DOR.

Selected by the prestigious <u>EURODRAM</u>, the text will be published in France in 2024 by <u>Harmatia Collection</u> at the University of Strasbourg.



In a seemingly easy theatre exercise, Rebeca, a young Roma woman, student at an elite acting school, is pushed to confront her biggest fear.

The short film "I matter" focuses on the social exclusion of young women at risk and their efforts to fit in society. "I matter" asks the following questions: what does it mean to be a girl, a Roma girl, to be raised in an orphanage and to struggle?

It is being developed into a feature at <u>LIM</u> and <u>Mediterranean Film Institute</u> and will be produced by Ada Solomon.

Alina Serban became the first Roma director entering the permanent repertoire of the National Theatre of Bucharest.

A theatre play about the situation of Roma children in the post-communist Romania's orphanages. It sheds light on the real story of a Roma girl who discovers, at a very young age, the differences of race, color and environment, yet manages to navigate through life and transform her complexes into determination and motivation.

I'm glad I wasn't born during slavery. To have the slave holder sell me at auctions and to end up far away from my mom. I'm glad I wasn't born during the Holocaust, either. To end up on those trains. (...)






